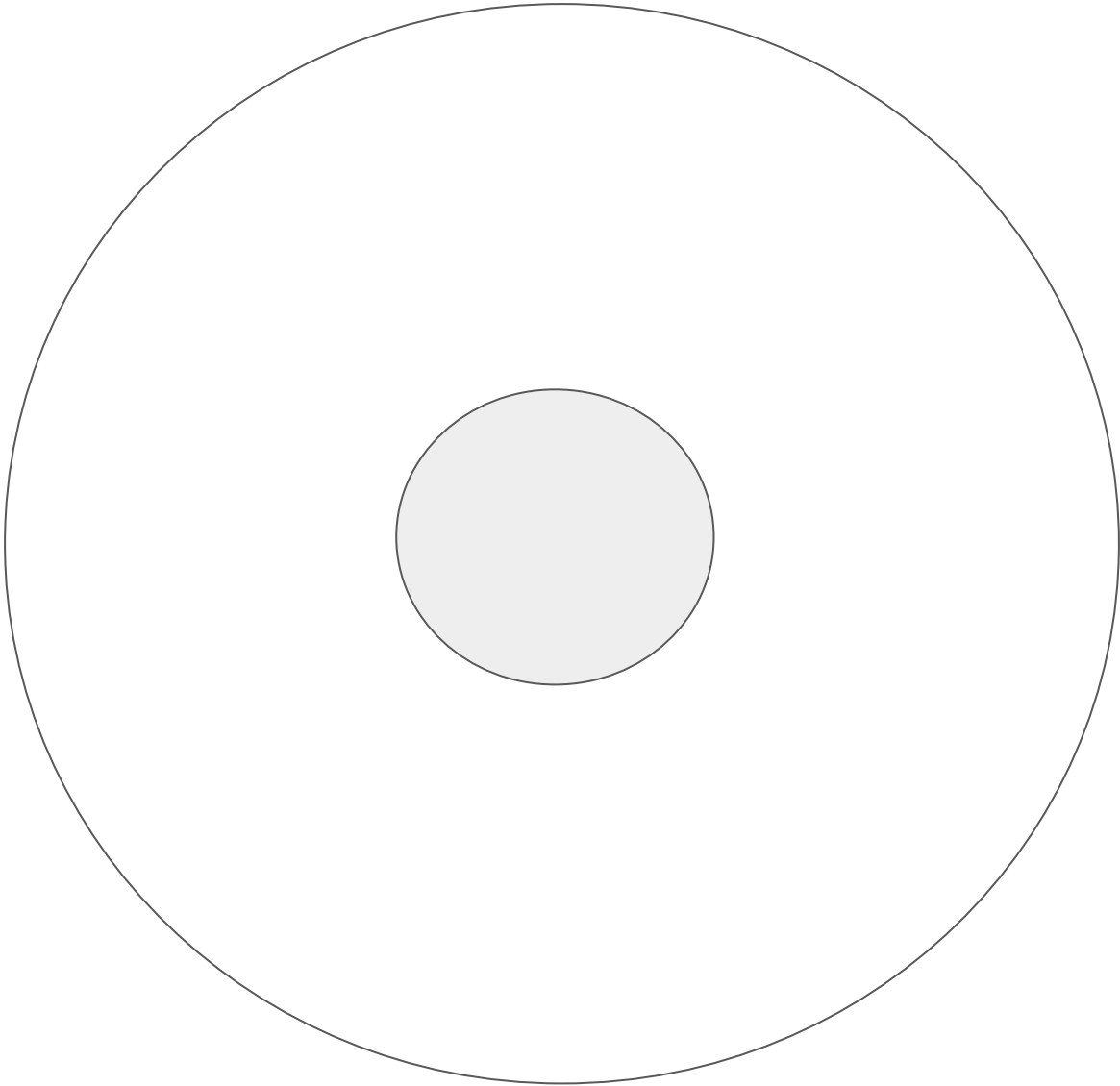


Topic Brainstorm
